Im Anschlusse an die entsprechende Arbeit im 18. Bande bringe ich die Auszüge aus Akt 2 bis 5 des Hamlet, so daß dieses eine Stück wenigstens als Prüfungsmaterial für die Idee wie für die Behandlung dienen, und vielleicht auch von dem Einen und Andern in der jetzigen Form schon als Arbeitsunterlage benutzt werden kann.

Für einige wenige der Namen-Abkürzungen fehlt augenblicklich der Chiffre-Schlüssel, den ich zu meinem Bedauern seiner Zeit in England zurückgelassen habe; doch schwächt Das nicht die stoffliche Ausnützung des Materials, wie diesem Mangel bei Veröffentlichung des Gesammtwerkes selbstverständlich auch abgeholfen werden wird.

Zum Zweck der praktischen Benutzung des Nachfolgenden werden die Anweisungen noch einmal wiederholt, welche sich schon im 18. Bande befinden.

Auch hier habe ich meinem jungen Freunde, Herrn Gymnasiallehrer Penner, für seine Mithilfe zu danken.

Das Technische der Anlage ist folgendermaßen gedacht:

Die Zählung der Globe Edition ist als Grundlage angenommen; wenn also z. B. das berühmte *runaway* in Romeo and Juliet behandelt wird, so würde die Ueberschrift lauten:

Romeo & J. III. 2. 6. *runaway*.

Hierauf folgen dann alle Lesarten der Herausgeber und Texterklärer (nicht die Quartos noch Folios, da deren Lesarten überall anderweitig zu finden sind), indem nur das neu vorgeschlagene Wort mit abgekürzter Namensangabe des Vorschlagenden angeführt wird; also:
